Overture provides residential, behavior, and day services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Are you a team player? Our opening is for a full-time Program Coordinator. You will be responsible for supporting a caseload of individuals receiving services in a host home setting.

Job duties:

- Developing, writing, implementing and monitoring of service and support plans for individuals receiving services.
- Compliance with state rules and regulations as required by the Division for Developmental Disabilities, Colorado Department of Public Health and Health Care Policy and Financing.
- Ensuring quality assurance of all Host Homes on caseload. This includes conducting announced and unannounced home visits on a monthly basis and making weekly contact with Providers to oversee the home environment for the people receiving services.
- Ensure person centered planning through all residential programs for the people we serve through support and respect.
- Create support plans in Therap and monitor data entry and progress towards goals.
- Mediating and communicating professionally between team members with varying backgrounds and beliefs, including family members, guardians, Host Home Providers and affiliated agencies.
- Attending team meetings and interdisciplinary team meetings to develop best practice supports for individuals served.
- Documenting contact notes regarding communication amongst anyone involved with the person in services and their team
- Responds to emergency situations and help with problem solving
- Assist with training new providers on individuals served and person-centered support methods
- Performs other duties, as assigned, within ability and responsibility level of the job



Qualifications:

- 2-3 years of experience and solid skills in working with people with developmental disabilities and/or their families preferred but not required
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university
- Flexibility – requires frequent travel to Overture office, appointments and homes in surrounding area
- Must pass background check and have reliable transportation with clean driving record.
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office components
- Professional attitude and teamwork mentality
- Ability to work independently



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
